

Importance of Sendai2015 and HFA

- economic, social, environmental shocks and disasters; beyond climate
- UN ISDR;
 - starts in early 1990s, prevention focused,
 - more systematic with Hyogo Framework for Action starting in 2005,
 - Making Cities Resilient Campaign in 2010
- Sendai2015: The first intergovernmental conference to shape the post-2015 development agenda with a strong vision and practice for recognition, engagement and empowerment of local and subnational governments
- Interlinkages
 - UNFCCC; started to focus on adaptation in 2002, no binding regime yet, focus on Loss and Damage since Warsaw 2013
 - Sustainable Development Goals: reference to disaster in Goal1.5 (end poverty), reference to HFA in Goal11.b (making cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable)
 - Climate Summit2014: Compact of Mayors and Resilient Cities Accelerator Initiative (resilience and adaptation indicators and reporting)
